The agreement will allow any Michigan high school student enrolled in any career-tech program at any state-approved Career and Technical Education Center or High School to receive university credits from Davenport. It is a landmark agreement and a truly valuable opportunity for students in these programs to advance toward careers in business, technology or health professions at Davenport University.
