December

January

March

• Priority deadline for filling your FAFSA! What does this mean? If you file your FAFSA by March 1, you will be considered for the maximum amount of financial aid.

May

- Inform every college of your decision to accept or decline the offer of admission by May 1.
- Take any AP/IB exams. Plan for test-out exams at your college.

June

 Send final transcripts after graduation, including any early credit courses earned.

July

- Payment portal opens.
- Housing assignment notifications will be sent!

August

- Wrap up any last steps with your admission rep!
- Move in with your suite mates!



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
